Abstract guidelines and submission

Call for papers

Contributions from all fields of behaviour, ecology, physiology, reproduction biology, conservation, and genetics are welcome. There will be three different forms of presentations:

- (1) oral contributions during the main conference programme
- (2) oral contributions during parallel sessions and workshop
- (3) posters

Please remember to indicate **your preference for an oral or poster presentation**.

Oral presentations

Oral presentations will consist of a **10 minutes talk** followed by 3 minutes discussion. Two minutes will be reserved to allow a smooth change between successive speakers. Oral presentations will be allocated to one of the main or parallel sessions.

Language

The conference will be conducted in English, thus all contributions have to be in **English** (British English).

Guidelines for the preparation of abstracts

Abstracts should briefly outline the aim of the study and methods applied, and present the main findings and principal conclusions. Abstracts must be in **British English**.

Please give 5 to 8 keywords!

Please ensure that your abstract conforms to the following guidelines:

File type:	Word file
Page margins:	Top: 0.98" Bottom: 0.98" Inside: 0.79" Outside: 0.59"
	If you use our layout sample , these margins are already predefined!
Abstract length:	Should not exceed 400 words (excluding title, authors' names, affiliations and keywords).
Line spacing:	throughout the abstract: exact 12 pt
Title:	Times New Roman, 11 pt, bold.
Authors:	Names of the authors (last name + first name, both full given): Times New Roman, 11 pt, small caps (if you do not know how to make small caps in Word, please see below*), not bold. Name, full address of institutions of all authors and E-mail address of the corresponding author: Times New Roman, normal script, 11 pt. For presentations with more than one author, the name of the presenting author should be indicated by <u>underlining</u> .
Text:	Times New Roman, 11 pt, continuous in normal script, justification (grouped style), with 2 cm left margins and exact 12 pt line spacing
References:	Can be given if the abstract incl. references does not exceed 400 words , but not necessarily

* How to make small caps in Word:

1. First letter of each word in capital letters, the rest in small letters (as usual)
2. mark the according words → font → Effects: tick the check box 'small caps'

Please note that after the review process, all comments and corrections have to be considered and set into place by the authors themselves. Revisions are in responsibility of authors.

Acceptance of submitted papers

All abstracts sent by **July 19th, 2017** will be reviewed by the conference scientific committee. Authors will receive notification, confirming whether their paper(s) have been accepted for a poster or oral presentation.

Guidelines for preparation of posters

Posters will only be accepted in portrait format. Posters will be fixed on poster boards and should not exceed 84 cm (width) x 118.9 cm (height) (A0).
